




How can Online Volunteers support you?

- Evaluating buildings damages and preparing reconstruction plans.
- GIS mapping of flood-affected communities.
- Resource mobilization, partnership and donor coordination.
- Monitoring, evaluation, and reporting.
- Designing communication materials.
- Mental health and counseling.
- Translation and interpretation between Arabic-French- English.

Examples of Online Volunteers delivery

Hurricane Irma in the Caribbean – deliver lifesaving information to the effected communities

After Hurricane Irma hit the Caribbean, UNICEF recruited a team of Online Volunteers and trained them to respond to messages on the situation and advice on how to stay safe. These volunteers have responded to 8,000 messages in 21 days and more than 25,000 people accessed this information using Facebook and Viber Messengers. To read more, click here
