# ABOUT the NSA

#### **BACKGROUND**

The 2015 Report of the UN Secretary-General (A/70/118) presented the **plan of action** to integrate volunteering for the next decade and beyond.

In line with paragraph 115 of this report, the **United Nations Volunteers (UNV) programme** is calling UN Member States to contribute with their **National Situation Analysis** (NSA) on volunteerism as part of the implementation of the plan of action.

Note Verbale (Reference: UNV-2017/01) and Technical Note on this were sent through the Permanent Missions to the United Nations in New York in 2017.

#### **PURPOSE**

The NSA aims at:

- Generate evidence and data on the scale, scope and impact of volunteerism as well as a body of knowledge on volunteerism;
- **Inform** discussions at national, regional and global levels on mainstreaming volunteerism as a cross-cutting means of the implementation for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

#### **OUTCOME**

Based on the NSAs submitted, UNV will facilitate preparation of five regional synthesis reports as an input to the 2019 regional consultations in preparation for the global technical meeting in 2020.

# STEPS to the completion of the NSA



#### **FOCAL POINT**

**Provide** the focal point with the Note Verbale (Reference: UNV-2017/01) dated 25 July 2017 and the Technical Note (version 24 June 2017) mentioned above; For copies of these documents, contact the Member State's Permanent Mission to the United Nations or unv.poa@unv.org



#### **MULTI-STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT**

Engage relevant ministries, national agencies, volunteer involving organizations, civil society, academia and the private sector in the development of the National Situation Analysis (\*This can be done through existing consultative mechanisms in the country e.g. Voluntary National Review).



## **GUIDELINES, GUIDING TEMPLATE and SUBMISSION**

**Conduct** the National Situation Analysis responding to the guiding questions for analysis in the Guidelines and Guiding Template attached;

Member States may invite UNV and volunteer involving organizations to support the NSA preparation – e.g. Facilitation of multi-stakeholder consultation processes;

NSA is to be submitted by 15 September 2018 through the Member State's Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York or by e-mail at unv.poa@unv.org

# GUIDELINES to facilitate the completion of the NSA in the following three key areas



Policy and legislation, leadership and resources

- How do values, traditional and cultural norms inform volunteerism in different contexts that contribute to peace and development?
- What are the critical conditions that allow volunteerism to leave a positive mark on peace and development?
- What does the above knowledge reveal about the future promotion of volunteerism?

#### examples

Favourable policies and regulatory frameworks, national plans, special awards, celebrations, committed leadership in government, or civil society.



Functioning schemes and organisations at the national and subnational levels

- What does volunteerism add to development that paid work does not?
- What values does volunteerism add to development process and its outcomes?
- How does volunteerism make development more efficient, effective and sustainable?
- What contributions does volunteerism make at the individual, community and national development levels?

#### examples

Promotion of volunteerism, youth initiatives, campaign, community initiatives etc related to mutual support, citizenship, employability, non-discrimination, support of vulnerable groups, etc...



The state of impact assessment, monitoring and evaluation of volunteer initiatives

- Do you have mechanisms/tools to measure contributions of volunteers? (for example, do you use the ILO Manual on the Measurement of Volunteer Work?)
- If mechanisms/tools exist, what type of data do you generate?

#### examples

Number of volunteers, hours volunteered, economic value of volunteerism, barriers and incentives to volunteerism, motivations, etc
